

#### **Scripture Reflection**

For Luke, Easter day is filled with action. The spice-bearing women go to the tomb and announce the resurrection to the Eleven, who consider this "idle tales." Peter goes to the



tomb but comes away not sure of what he has seen. Two disciples leave Jerusalem and head for Emmaus. It is a day of journeying, a day that illustrates that with Jesus we are a journeying, pilgrim people. The Emmaus event is about being "on the road," about the new things we are called to do by the Risen Christ after we have heard the story and shared the broken bread. + As the two disciples approached the village with a Stranger, the day is drawing to a close, but faith is about to dawn. Jesus acts as if to go farther. He will not impose himself on disciples, then and now; he waits for an invitation to stay with them, and when this is offered as a first response of the travelers to his story, he accepts it readily. Jesus enters the house as guest but then becomes the Host. At table he takes, blesses, breaks, and gives the bread. On the road he had already broken the Scriptures for them, and these ritual actions at table complete the revelation. Then he vanishes from their sight. The bread has been eaten, the story has been told, the hospitality has been offered and accepted. Word and bread and hospitalitythese will continue to make Jesus present to and understood in his post-resurrection church. + Emmaus is the place of conversion, of broken people healed by the broken word and the broken bread. Wounded hearts have become burning hearts, disfigured dreams are transfigured, and death is recognized as the way to invincible life. But Emmaus is not the place to stay. The two disciples turn and return to the Jerusalem community, driven on their mission of proclaiming the Risen One to the wounded community of the Eleven. There they hear that the forgiving and compassionate Jesus has already appeared to Simon, the disciple most wounded by his denial of his Master. + Week after week, in the Liturgy of the Word as we gather at the Eucharistic table, we share in the new story and new hospitality that Jesus offered to the Emmaus disciples. The temptation is to prefer the old story, the old bread of power and violence and exclusion; to prefer the option to escape from suffering rather than seeing it as inevitable in our traveling with Jesus, to rationalize about what is too difficult and too unjust to forgive. But Emmaus challenges us to walk through our daily lives in the company of the Christ who reveals himself in Scripture and Eucharist, and also in the other unexpected "strangers" whom we may meet and who share with us the bread of their lives that proclaim hope in the face of suffering and apparent hopelessness. The climax of the Emmaus narrative does not happen in the house but in the mission that takes the disciples, with burning hearts, back onto the road.

# **Questions to Ponder**

When was the last time you felt your heart burn within you? Find those spaces where your heart burns and dwell there. As a theologian once said, "Don't' ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive, and go do it. Because what the world needs is more people who have come alive." + The Easter season gifts us with fifty days to reflect on our calling to be disciples of the risen Christ. Use this time to discern the people, places, work, and social causes that make you come alive.



#### **APRIL 25TH-FEAST OF ST. MARK**



The feast of St. Mark offers us the opportunity to give thanks for the work of all the evangelists, who gave us the teachings and stories and insights into the life of Jesus and his mission. + The Gospel according to St. Mark is generally recognized as the first to be called a Gospel, "the Good News." Both Matthew and Luke drew from Mark's work as they wrote their own versions. (John's style is entirely unique.) The fact that the

work of the evangelists is called "Good News" reminds us that Jesus came to reveal God's great love and mercy. + Do we read the Bible regularly? Did you ever consider yourself as a person of The Book? Do you ponder God's words to you? Mark's Gospel is the shortest one. Have you ever sat down and read it straight through? Even though we hear much of it in the Lectionary, reading the whole text puts all of those separate passages into context and often reveals new insight. + Reading Mark's word today (or soon) would be a good way to honor this evangelist.


