



Scripture Reflection

In last Sunday's first reading, Philip did not even understand that seeing Jesus means seeing the Father. Here in Acts, a transformed Philip fulfills Jesus' commission to bear witness to him, "in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria,

and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). On the Third and Fourth Sundays of Easter, the readings from Acts show Peter witnessing to Christ in Jerusalem. Now, through Philip's testimony, the good news has been proclaimed in Samaria. + The psalmist's words reflect the rejoicing in the city: "Shout joyfully to God, all the earth...come and see the works of God, his tremendous deeds among the children of Adam" (Psalm 66:1,5). The reference to the children of Adam reminds us of the universal reach of the Gospel, as it goes out from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth. + Peter's letter reminds Christians to be ready to bear witness at any time, and to do so "with gentleness and reverence." This is a timely reminder for a church whose witness has not always been gentle or respectful. 🕂 The Gospel reading brings us full circle back to Philip. His testimony and his powerful works (casting out demons, healing the sick) are the marks of the Holy Spirit's power, received at Pentecost. As Jesus told Philip and his other disciples, he would not leave them orphaned when he left them to ascend to God but would give them an Advocate to remain with them and to bind them in unity to one another and to the Son and the Father. The Acts reading also demonstrates that the gift of the Spirit is for all believers, for Peter and John are sent to Samaria specifically to pray for the new believers to receive the Spirit.

+ Questions to Ponder

Are you ready to give an explanation for the hope that you possess? + Have you ever felt the presence of the Holy Spirit assuring you that you are not alone? + Spend some time declaring what God has done for you.

The Practice of Hope

Peter tells the first-century Christians to be ready to give an explanation for their hope. Imagine someone has asked you: what is the reason for your hope? Write down your reason to hope. + In the encyclical, **Spe salvi**, Pope Benedict XVI writes that "to come to know God...means to receive hope." Read the first three paragraphs of this document to begin to understand how, through hope, we have been granted new life. + This week pray The Act of Hope: **O Lord God**, **I hope by your grace for the pardon of all my sins and after life here to gain eternal happiness because you have promised it, who are infinitely powerful, faithful, kind and merciful. In this hope I intend to live and die. Amen.**

WHEREVER YOU TURN by Laura Kelly Fanucci

Step inside your own church like a stranger. What do you see? Statues and stained glass tell a striking story, but our eyes learn to gaze over the sharp contrasts. Stand back and take in the jarring juxtapositions: the gentle Madonna and Child near the stark crucifix, or the Holy Family next to St. Michael battling the dragon. Within a single church we glimpse birth and death, joy and grief--the fullness of the life of faith. 🕂 The month of May holds this same abundance like a poem. Prepare yourself for the whirlwind: sacraments and celebrations, graduations and confirmations, gardens to plant and yards to rend and summer to plan. In a span of a few short weeks. Easter meets Pentecost-a month of rushing and leaping. We stand breathless from running to the empty tomb, then tilt our heads to heaven watching the Ascension, mouths open in awe. By month's end, we will find ourselves with Mary on Elizabeth's doorstep at the Feast of the Visitation, two cousins embracing with cries of prayer and shouts of joy. + Yet darker clouds gather, too. We cannot forget Good Friday; Christ's passion hangs fresh in our memory. Even Mary and Elizabeth, who rejoice at the Visitation, will know deep suffering; the children within them will both be killed by powerful forces who fear the prophetic truth. Motherhood means dying and rising, even for these holy women. So does every calling: the sacrifice of service, the surrender of parenting, the evolution of religious life, the mysteries of marriage, priesthood and the single life, or the vocations of work and friendship.

QUEEN OF ANGELS ROSARY GROUP


